Message from the Board President

s many of you know, the Finance Committee took a "Vote of No Confidence" in the Board President in Executive Session after their Tuesday, August 13, 2019 meeting, "Because of continuing problems with communications, irregularities in procurements, irregularities in appointment of Board members, and concerns about management of HOAMCO."

On Thursday, August 15, the Board Treasurer and the Board Liaison to the Committee met with the Committee Chair and Secretary to review the specific issues and work towards solutions. The Committee Chair then met with the Board President and Treasurer to develop ways to resolve the issues. While there were still some disagreements, they came to agreement on ways to improve communication and resolve the issues.

IMPROVING COMMUNICATIONS

The Board President apologized for not submitting the Board's revision of the scope of work for the Financial Procedures Review in a more timely manner. The original scope of the review was formulated prior to the employment of HOAMCO and included items such as Homeowner Relations and Staff Management which were not in the purview of the Finance Committee. The Review will be rescheduled for a later date to allow time for the Board and the Committee Chair to discuss the revised scope. The issues not included in the Financial Procedures Review will be addressed through a Board Working Group.

IRREGULARITIES IN PROCUREMENT

The Board and the ECIA General Manager make every effort to comply with the Procurement Policies, which require three bids for projects over \$25,000 and review of such contracts by the Finance Committee. Sometimes bids are solicited and fewer than three vendors respond, and sometimes there was only one vendor capable of doing the work in the state. This was the case with some of the pool contractors, however due diligence was exercised to ensure that we had qualified vendors to do the work. The pool proposals were reviewed by the Finance Committee on February 27, 2019 and recommendations were sent to the Board. The Board followed the Committee's recommendations and sent the proposals to the Attorney to be put into a legal contract form. The Board received the contracts back from the Attorney and approved them by unanimous email vote on March 7 and signed on March 8. At that point, the work on the pool had already been delayed by 3 weeks and we were starting to lose contractors who had made commitments to us but were forced to take other work by the delays. The contracts were sent to the Finance Committee on March 11 for their meeting the next day. The Board and the General

Manager are working together to improve compliance with the Procurement Policy.

IRREGULARITIES IN APPOINTMENT OF BOARD MEMBERS

In Sept. 2018, three Board positions were open due to resignations. The Board interviewed five candidates and chose the three whom we felt were most qualified. The terms for the three appointees were assigned by "luck-of-the-draw" for 7 months, 19 months and 31 months, and they were appointed at the Sept. 27 Board Meeting. At the October 24 Board Meeting, one of the newly appointed directors got into a verbal argument with a resident and resigned from the Board the next day. Both of the other appointees expressed interest in filling the longer terms. The Chair of the Election Committee was consulted and gave the Board her opinion. Since the terms had been arbitrarily assigned and the appointees had not been elected to a specific term, having them resign their current positions and be immediately reappointed to the longer terms would be permissible under the Bylaws. The Bylaws Review Committee is evaluating the procedure for Board appointments and will be making recommendations for revisions.

CONCERNS ABOUT MANAGEMENT OF HOAMCO

The Board received a list of Financial Management Questions from the Finance Committee in May 2018. Starting in October with the addition of an Assistant General Manager with extensive financial background, and her subsequent promotion to General Manager, HOAMCO began to implement procedures to address the issues of concern. They also conducted a Forensic Audit to determine causes and solutions for the May 2018 embezzlement, and repaid all of ECIA's losses. Throughout the year the General Manager and HOAMCO Senior Staff have addressed the Finance Committee's issues with varying degrees of success, partly due to staff turnover in HOAMCO's New Mexico office in Albuquerque. Steps continue to be taken, including the Financial Procedures Review, to address the issues.

Due to the concerns of some residents about the "Vote of No Confidence" at the August 22, Meeting, the Board called a Town Hall Meeting on August 29, to answer questions. It was attended by approximately 50 residents, some who were dissatisfied with the Board's performance, some who called for the resignation of the Board President and other Board members, and some who supported the Board and the hard work we do. New ECIA Committee on Environmental Stewardship

he Eldorado Environmental Stewardship Committee (EESC) was established by the ECIA Board on April 18, 2019. The mission of the EESC is to develop, for the ECIA, ecologically sound and sustainable environmental practices that promote a healthy and safe community. Prior to the creation of the EESC, the ad hoc Environmental Advisory Group drafted, for ECIA Board Approval, a Pesticide Application Procedure to provide guidance to the Board and staff on Integrated Pest Management, an Environmental Impact Management Policy and a list of minimal risk (least toxic) pesticides.

The EESC has completed a baseline environmental audit of the ECIA buildings (Community Center and Barn) and sent 20 recommendations for immediate action by the ECIA Board. Using the baseline environmental audit, the EESC will be evaluating possible ways to reduce the environmental impact of ECIA activities. An annual audit will be conducted by the EESC to measure our progress.

Future work of the EESC includes 1) creating an evaluation process for materials used in construction, maintenance and other activities of the ECIA and resource use (e.g. recycling and composting) in conjunction with the Conservation, Facilities and Grounds, Roads, and Stable Committees or any other appropriate groups or individuals; 2) establishing a program of community outreach regarding environmentally sustainable and cost-effective practices; and 3) improving the ability of ECIA members to be informed on issues of Integrated Pest Management and Environmental Stewardship by establishing an environmental library that is both physical and online.


Ravens and Crows: An Essay

STEM Program Prepares Students for 21st Century



n 2001 the National Science Foundation implemented a program for kindergarten to 12th grade students with the acronym STEM which stands for science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. El Dorado Community School, with guidance from Los Alamos National Laboratories participates in STEM programs designed to prepare students for 21st century careers. Knowledge and skills in computer science, robotics, and artificial intelligence in technology are increasingly important in employment

opportunities and our students must be ready to enter this job market.

Science classroom teacher Hope Cahill follows Next Generation Science Standards which adhere to the standards of STEM. Students learn collaboration, questioning, problem solving and critical thinking which are essential to scientists and technicians. El Dorado Community School has embraced Next Generation Science Standards since 2012.

Eldorado 6th grade science students recently participated in a program about natural resources to teach them these skills by designing an invention to reduce greenhouse gases. Each student offered a plan and after collaboration one invention was chosen. One student made a model of a solar powered wind turbine that pulled in greenhouse gases, filtered them out and stored them in an aluminum container. The model was the State Merit Winner of the 3M Science competition and used all the elements of STEM.

Included in the El Dorado PTA After-School Enrichment Program is Beginner Coding to start students on the path to computer programming. Art, music, and creative movement, as well as a myriad of other classes are offered too. In a fast-changing world El Dorado Community School is making strides to keep up with the pace.


