

#### **Caregiver Training Offered**

Free training for those who would like to become professional caregivers will be offered on Saturday and Sunday, April 22–23, from 9 AM to 4 PM at Santa Fe Community College. The nonprofit Coming Home Connection of Santa Fe, which provides the training, also matches caregivers with families who need their service. The organization is specifically looking for people who reside in or near Eldorado.

"Many local families need caregiving services, and more local people are needed to serve them," explained Coming Home Connection director Celia Owens.

Caregivers that are arranged through Coming Home Connection receive an hourly wage, and the families are charged on a sliding scale. Caregivers who wish to volunteer their services also are needed to attend the two-day session.

Anyone interested in the training, or who want to know more about the caregiving profession, should call (505) 988-2468 to register for a preliminary orientation. These sessions take place on Wednesday evenings and last about two hours. The location and further details will be provided upon making the call.

"There is a perception that caregiving is a lower-rung occupation, but nothing could be further from the truth," said Owens. "Caregiving requires the ability to think on your feet, make fast decisions, and assess situations that can change daily, and there is an immediate need for people to do this work."
