# El Dorado Fire & Rescue Annual Community BBQ

El Dorado Fire & Rescue Annual Community Barbeque Sunday, September 16, 2018, noon to 4:00 pm, ECIA Community Center

I Dorado Fire & Rescue Service is presenting its Annual Open House and Barbeque on **Sunday, September 16** from **noon until 4:00 pm**. The event will be held at the ECIA Community Center, All members of the Eldorado area community are invited to attend this free event!

The El Dorado Fire Brigade was started in 1976 when there were fewer than 400 houses in the area. Its first home was in a barn at the Eldorado Community Center. Eldorado was then designated an official fire district of Santa Fe County, and the Brigade subsequently became known as El Dorado Fire & Rescue Service. As the Eldorado area community has grown over the years, so has El Dorado Fire & Rescue Service. It is now the highest rated volunteer fire district in New Mexico.

The 100% volunteer organization has come a long way since those early days with strong community support. The volunteers strive to engage with the community through outreach and educational activities, such as this Annual Open House and BBQ and refresh their roster with continuous new volunteer recruitment. The department also invests heavily in time and funding for training certifications in both fire protection and medical care with the goal of enhanced safety, effectiveness and response times for





emergency services. Community residents are encouraged to join the group.

The Annual Open House and Barbeque is a thank-you to the community as well as an educational event. All of the service's emergency vehicles will be on display for inspection, and department members will be on hand to meet and talk with attendees throughout the event. Smokey Bear may be there too. There will be demonstrations, activities for kids and live music through the afternoon. And of course, there will be plenty of great food!

Again this year, old, unwanted fire extinguishers will be accepted for recycling. Fire extinguishers should not be put in the regular trash or taken to the Eldorado Convenience Center, as they are considered hazardous waste. They will be hauled to Buckman Road Recycling and Transfer Station (BuRRT) at the end of the day as a service to residents.

The El Dorado Fire and Rescue Service looks forward to seeing you at this traditional community gathering!



# **Board Message: Moving Forward with**

## **HOAMCO**

s most of you are probably aware, there have been some concerns about the HOAMCO management of the ECIA. This came to a head with the fraudulent use of the ECIA credit cards by a HOAMCO employee during a time when our General Manager was on sick leave. HOAMCO has taken full responsibility for the incident, and all losses incurred by the ECIA, and they are in the process of conducting a forensic audit of all financial transactions during the employee's tenure to ensure that there was no other malfeasance. A full report of that audit will be made public as soon as it is completed.

This incident alerted the HOAMCO corporate office that all was not well in our community and that they needed to address and correct several issues. The ECIA Board of Directors met with HOAMCO's Chief Operations Officer and their Vice President for New Mexico on June 4 to discuss the credit card fraud and other issues that were brought up by the chairs of the finance and the facilities and grounds committees. These issues included concerns about project management, financial accountability, and staffing.

At the meeting, the HOAMCO senior management shared a new policy on card usage that is being implemented at all the HOA's they manage. In addition, they were very receptive to the concerns raised by the committees and agreed to put together a Procedural Improvement Plan to address the issues and present their findings at the June 27 Board Meeting. The proposal was accepted at that meeting as a general outline of the problems that needed to be addressed. However, the board requested a more specific task list outlining how procedural changes will be implemented and that periodic progress reports be submitted. Also, the board requested that HOAMCO corporate staff be involved in the onsite training of the new assistant general manager and the Procedural Audit. The HOAMCO senior staff have been in Eldorado numerous times over the past 6 weeks working with the ECIA staff in a very hands-on way to fulfill that agreement.

We will continue to evaluate HOAMCO as our management company over the next six to nine months as we move forward together to improve procedures, performance, communication, and transparency. The June 20, "Report to the Board of Directors," and the latest, "Eldorado Task List and Progress Update August 2018," are posted on the ECIA website eldoradosf.org under Resident Resources.

# Contact List for Pesticide Notice

n November 2017, the ECIA Board established an Environmental Advisory Ad Hoc Committee (EAAHC) whose purpose would be to advise the board in three areas:

- ► A proposed policy for IPM (Integrated Pest Management) practices.
- A proposed policy for environmental practices for new construction and facility mainte-
- To develop guidelines for performing an annual environmental audit.

The mission of the EAAHC is to promote a safe and healthy community at the Eldorado at Santa Fe facilities through ecologically sound and sustainable environmental practices that protect human and environmental health and safeguard our community.

In the event that the application of a pesticide or herbicide is deemed necessary, the EAAHC is establishing a procedure for notification of Eldorado residents. Affected areas will be cordoned off, and an email news brief will be sent out.

We realize there may be some residents who would like to be notified who do not use the internet and would not receive these email news briefs. If you or someone you know does not receive ECIA emails and would like to receive notification in some other way (via text or landline) if pesticides or herbicides are applied on ECIA premises, please contact Courteney Handy at chandy@haomco.com.

## Eldoradio 1660 AM

ldorado's own local radio station is now in its ninth year of low-power, low-babbler broadcasting for community residents, at 1660 kHz, right at the top of the AM radio dial. Most of the 24-hour broadcast day is just music: a kaleidoscopic variety of familiar classics, jazz, easy-listening and relaxing music. No commercials or fund drives, but a few select programs on a regular schedule.

**Every morning** at **7 am**, *Good Morning, Eldorado*, begins the day with nature's wake-up, singing birds, followed by news of events in Eldorado and Santa Fe, including the lunch menus at the Ken & Patty Adam Senior Center and ECIA Board and committee meetings. At **10:30 am**, **Monday through Friday**, *Break-Time*, is a chance to sit down for a few minutes with something different: history, stories, interviews, conversations, poetry, and even a bit of comedy.

On weekends, ELDORADIO features *Saturday Matinee*, music and entertainment recorded in live performance, beginning at noon. Every Sunday, at noon, *Retro Radio*, take you back to the "Golden Age of Radio" some 70, 80 or more years ago. Through October, a celebration of the Orson Welles' 1938 "War of the Worlds" broadcast, brings you a reading of the H.G. Wells novel,



published 120 years ago, from which the American "bad boy" actor created his famous radio show 80 years ago. The **1 pm Sunday** readings, in half-hour segments, began **Aug. 5**. Eldorado's local station rebroadcasts the original 1938 CBS program annually on Halloween.

This month's Saturday Matinees include a 1958 Benny Goodman concert, the Native American Rose Hill Singers, Albuquerque's Lewie Wickham, and the Broadway musical *Hamilton*. From time to time, ELDORADIO also drops in "Concert Previews" in advance of scheduled performances in the area. Limited by FCC rules, ELDORADIO 1660 AM has only 0.1 watt and covers only Eldorado.

Visitors, please come in through the main gate, and follow directions to the parking area near the upper arena. Volunteers and signs will be posted to direct cars. - Other improper driving.

## Q: Hey Eldo, What ever happened with the credit card fraud by one of the ECIA/HOAMCO employees?

The answer to this question comes from David McDonald, board president. He reports that in the middle of May 2018, it was discovered that a HOAMCO employee who had recently been dismissed, had been using ECIA credit cards for personal purchases that totaled between \$3,000 and \$5,000. HOAMCO was immediately notified, and after verifying that the purchases were not office related, the sheriff's office was called. A Deputy Sheriff came out to take a report and immediately turned it over to a detective who came out the same day. Investigators were unable to locate the employee for questioning and, based on the allegations and evidence that we provided, they issued an arrest warrant.

In the meantime, HOAMCO met with the ECIA Board Officers to address the fraud and other issues in early June. HOAMCO took complete responsibility for their employee's malfeasance and reimbursed the ECIA for all fraudulent charges and funded a forensic audit to make sure that there was no other, undiscovered fraud.

As of August 28, in spite of ongoing investigation, the sheriff's department has been unable to locate the suspect, and no arrest has been made. The detective who took the report will be giving us an update shortly.
