MINUTES COVENANT COMPLIANCE POLICY UPDATE TASK FORCE JULY MEETING

- 1. <u>Participants</u>. Board President Amelia Adair, Ken Howard, Board Member, Architecture and Covenant Compliance Coordinator Mark Young, Architecture Committee Co-Chairs Katherine Mortimer and John McDermon. Katherine Mortimer served as note-taker. Community members on zoom: Joe M., Caryn Walz, S Worley.
- 2. Agenda & Minutes. The members approved the July Agenda and June Minutes
- 3. <u>Board liaison update</u>. Welcome Ken Howard, new Board Liaison.
- 4. Work to develop initial draft Compliance Policy.
 - a. No one recalls the arbitration option being used in ECIA.
 - b. HOA act requires hearing before fines can be imposed.
 - c. Review of Problems Matrix to understand the breadth of violations needing to be addressed. Updates made to document in shared folder.
 - d. Enforcement mechanisms owners and, by extension, renters:
 - i. Covenants limit member suspensions for up to 30-days. What about ongoing violations, does that allow that 30-days to be restarted for every day the violation continues. [Amelia will ask the ECIA attorney]
 - ii. Fines accrued should be paid even if they eventually come into compliance.
 - iii. There should be a way to appeal payment due to extenuating circumstances that delayed coming into compliance.
 - iv. Fines could be suspended from accruing if agreements are made by staff to allow people to come into compliance by a specific date.
 - v. Does this add to staff work? We could send unpaid fines to a collection agency.
 - vi. 3 speeds of notice to repair timing, depending upon urgency of violation.
 - vii. The draft policy was reviewed and edits made.
 - e. <u>HOMEWORK</u>: Review arbitration panel language and suggest edits at next meeting. How much detail do we want to include in this document. Rules, evidence, notice, witnesses, etc. Could be a separate policy.
 - i. John will define categories of violations
 - ii. Mark and Ken will review revised language for detailed comments
- 5. Open Forum. (Public Comment)
 - a. Notifications, one of those letters need to be a registered letter or how can you verify that it was received. Discussion: If people don't sign for letter received.
 - b. Violations that are neighbor-dependent can create a toxic situation, especially when fines come down the road.
 - c. Could people just reach over to let themselves in once the key card is activated for that amenity.
 - d. Could notifications be given to details regarding specific amenities like the dog park and pool.
 - e. Can members of the public access the draft documents online and not just see the section being edited at the time? Sharing working documents could be a problem until they are ready for community input. The complete first draft will be made available and meetings scheduled to get community input.
 - f. When draft is finalized, how will its availability be noticed? Multiple channels of communication will be used and document will be available online and hard copies at the office.
